9.00 Easter Communion – this will be streamed and a 'said' service

10.30 An Outdoor Service for Easter Day. Do arrive in good time so we can take track and trace details and get you all socially spaced. There is a double-sided Hymn Sheet included in this posting. Please bring one along on paper or your 'phone' if at all possible.

UPDATE ON GETTING BACK TO CHURCH

If all goes to plan next Sunday will be our last 'only on line' service.

We are allowed and are planning to return to church as it was between lockdowns, with singers at the front and social spacing, track and trace, etc. **AS FROM SUNDAY 18th**.

We could begin next Sunday [11th] but have chosen to wait the extra week to make sure we don't rush in but take our time to make the worship we offer the best and the safest we can.

We print in full the advice for those who might be concerned about attending:

12. What about those worshippers who are over 70 or clinically vulnerable, those who may have symptoms, and those self-isolating?

Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID-19, including people who are aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions. Individuals who fall within this group are advised to stay at home as much as possible and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household. You may want to consider whether, based on your local circumstance, you have set times when churches are open solely for those particularly vulnerable to COVID-19, such as those over 70 or clinically vulnerable.

Those who are considered to be extremely clinically vulnerable to COVID-19 will have been advised to shield and are currently advised not to meet more than one person from outside of their own household, and therefore not currently advised to attend places of worship.

Anyone showing symptoms of COVID-19 (a new continuous cough, a high temperature or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell) should not attend the place of worship due to the risk that they pose to others; they should self-isolate at home immediately with other members of their household. Remote participation should be considered, for example by live streaming. This applies equally to individuals who work at the place of worship.

Where individuals are self-isolating due to a possible or confirmed case of COVID-19 in the household, or because they have been requested to so by NHS Test & Trace, they should participate remotely.

REMEMBERING OUR LOVED ONES - A PLACE OF MEMORIAL

As Covid continues so many more of us have been unable to attend a funeral of a loved one or a friend. Others will have been unable to grieve in a variety of ways because of the guidelines enforced at the moment. Many can't visit the graves of loved ones because of travel restrictions.

Many have come from within and outside our Benefice to St Wystan's in Repton to light a candle and say a prayer, but we felt that for others, perhaps you, a family member or a friend, that might not be enough or that going into church might feel awkward.

Until mid-April we have set aside an area near the Lychgate in St Wystan's Churchyard in Repton as a Place of Memorial. A low fence encloses an area of grass and the first yew tree. On one side there is a Cross made out of the Christmas Trees used in Church this last December.

Anyone is most welcome to come and place flowers, photos, momentos, or any item with special significance on the ground either under the tree or around the Cross. If you wish to hang a prayer, photo, ribbon or lightweight momento from the tree you are most welcome to do so. [We know that Churchyard regulations don't allow such things but this is a special one off event in a defined area so we are turning a blind eye for 7 weeks].

All we ask is that you don't leave anything made from glass, or which is dangerous or easily breakable, and please, do not hang things from the tree over the path. We reserve the right to remove items that are not 'safe'.

The Place of Memorial will continue through Easter [our Christian Festival marking the death of Jesus and Celebrating His Resurrection] another time when many people also remember loved ones by visiting graves and so on. At our services on Mothering Sunday and Easter a special prayer will be said for all our loved ones.

We plan to clear the area later in April so would ask if you wish to retrieve a momento you do so before **Monday April 19**th.

We do pray continually for all those who die and for those who mourn the loss of loved ones – may you know God's peace if you are mourning at this time.
