- 1 Chronicles 16:34 Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever.
- **Deuteronomy 7:9** Know therefore that the Lord your God is God; he is the faithful God, keeping his covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love him and keep his commandments.
- **Jeremiah 31:3** I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness.
- **Exodus 34:6** And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, "The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness.
- 1 John 4:16-18 And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them. This is how love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment: In this world we are like Jesus. There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.
- Psalm 136:26 Give thanks to the God of heaven. His love endures forever.
- Psalm 86:15 But you, Lord, are a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness.
- **Psalm 36:5-6** Your love, Lord, reaches to the heavens, your faithfulness to the skies. Your righteousness is like the highest mountains, your justice like the great deep.
- **Psalm 107:8-9** Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind, for he satisfies the thirsty and fills the hungry with good things.
- **Psalm 52:8** But I am like an olive tree flourishing in the house of God; I trust in God's unfailing love for ever and ever.

- **Psalm 23:6** Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.
- **Psalm 51:1** Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.
- John 15:9-10 As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. If you keep
 my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in
 his love.
- Romans 8:37-39 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- 1 John 3:1 See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!
- 1 John 4:19 We love because he first loved us.
- 1 John 4: 8 Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God.
- **John 15: 12-13** My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.
- 1 Peter 4:8 Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.
- 1 Corinthians 16:14 Do everything in love.
- Colossians 3:14 Above all, be loving. This ties everything together perfectly.
- **Ephesians 4:2-3** Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.
- 1 John 4:21 And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister."
- Luke 6:35 But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked.
- Luke 6:27-31 But to you who are listening I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn to them the other also. If someone takes your coat, do not withhold your shirt from them. Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you.
- 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away.
